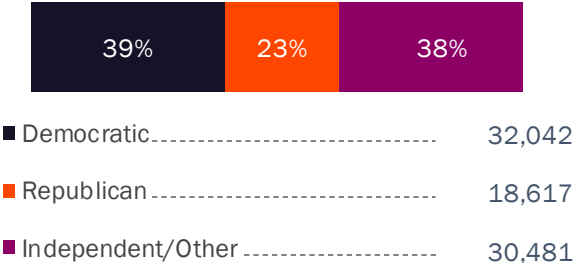

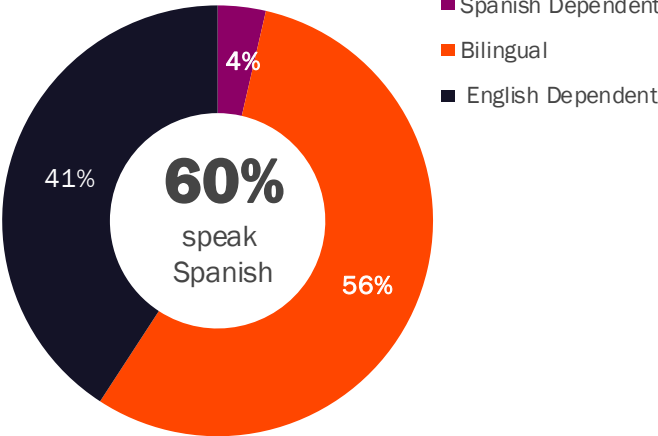

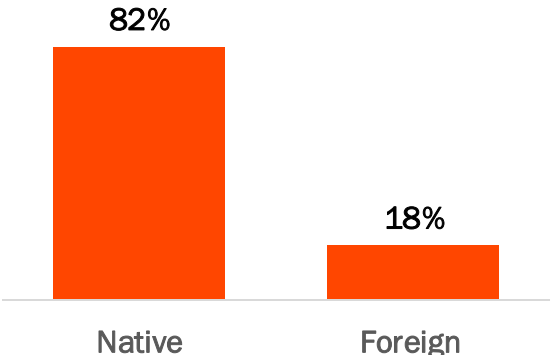

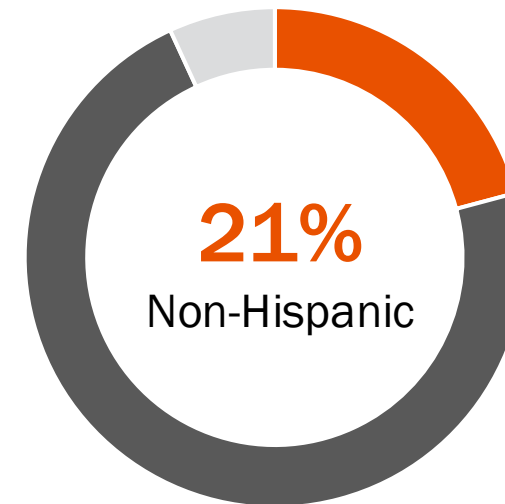

Only 14% of Hispanics Believe U.S. is Headed in the Right Direction

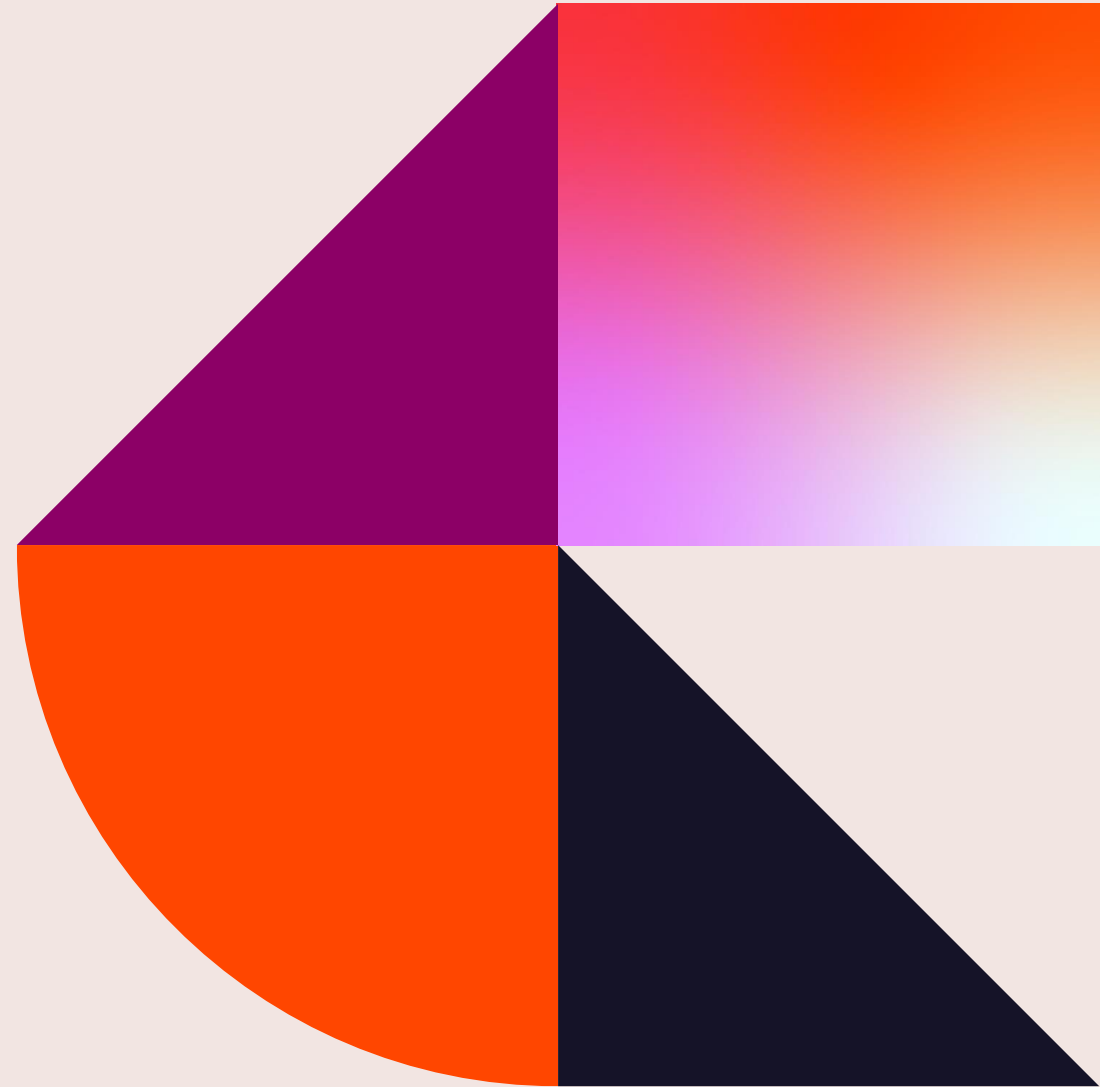
In general, do you believe that the United States is headed in the right direction, or has it gone off on the wrong track?

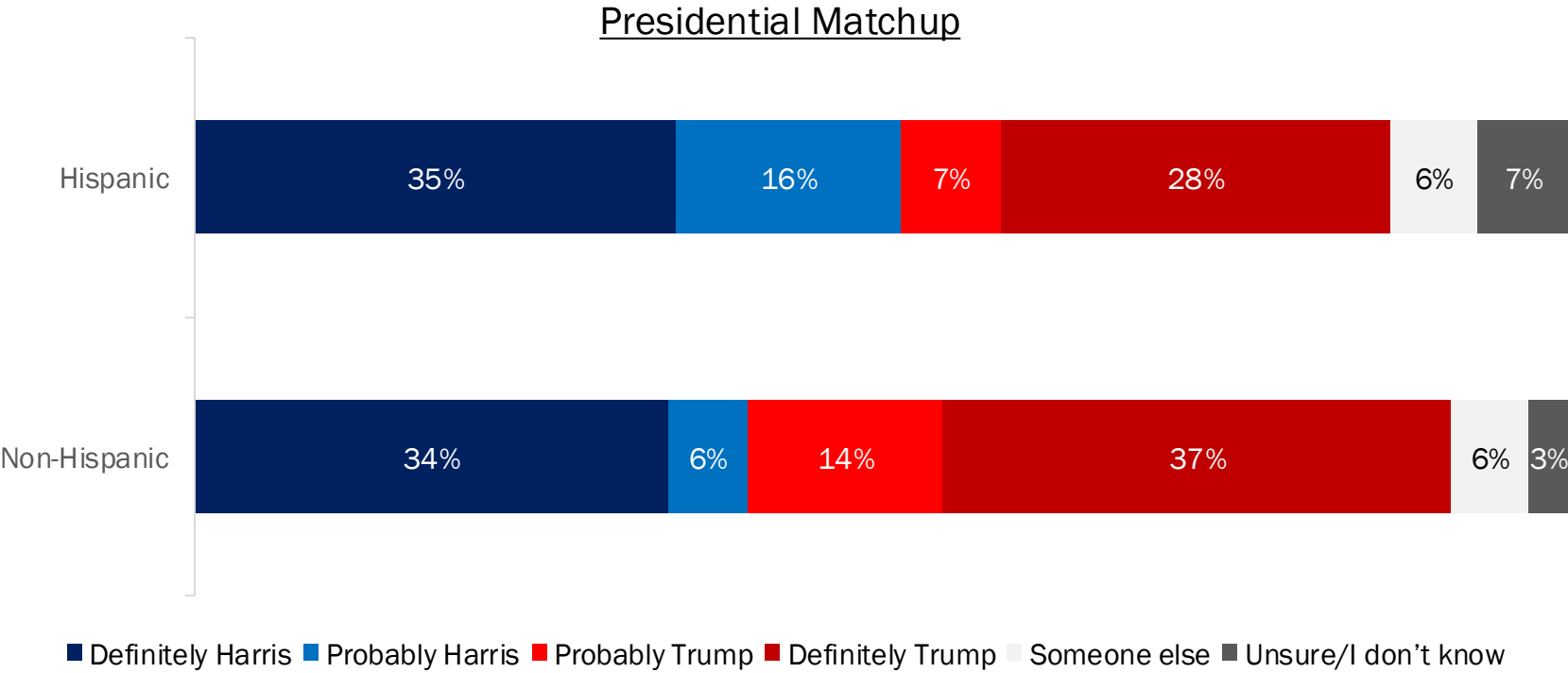

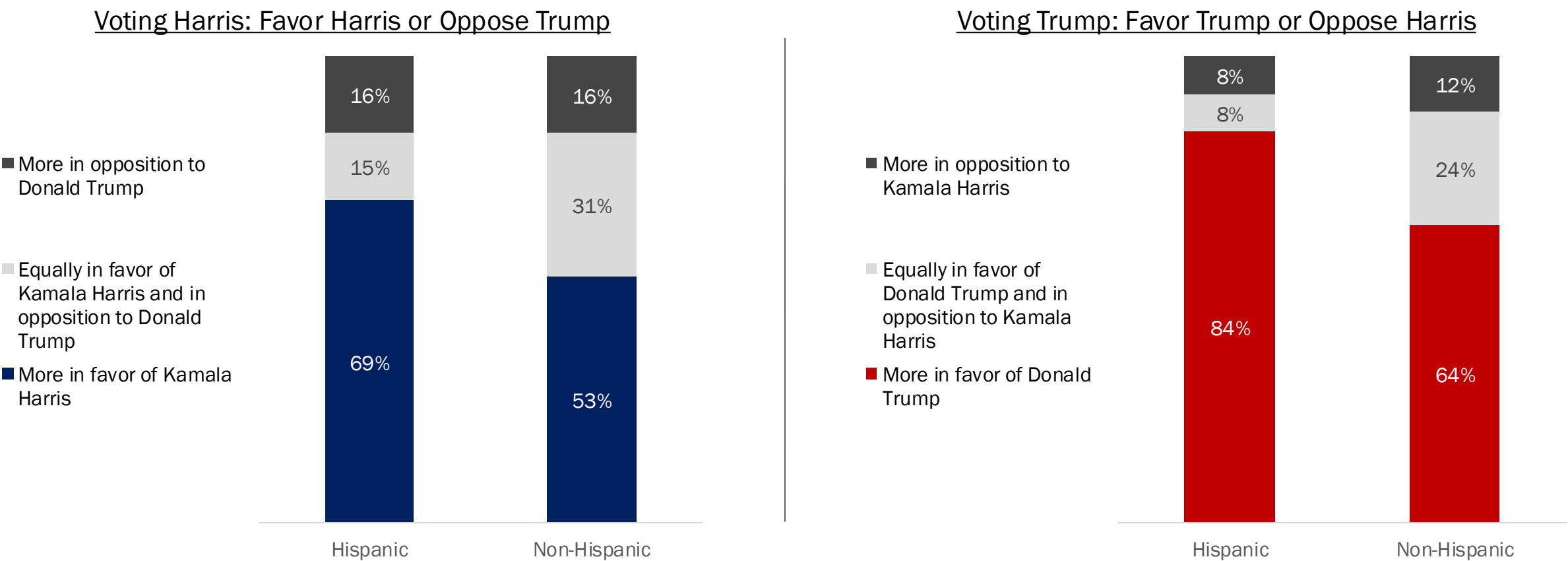

Trump Voters Are More Enthusiastic

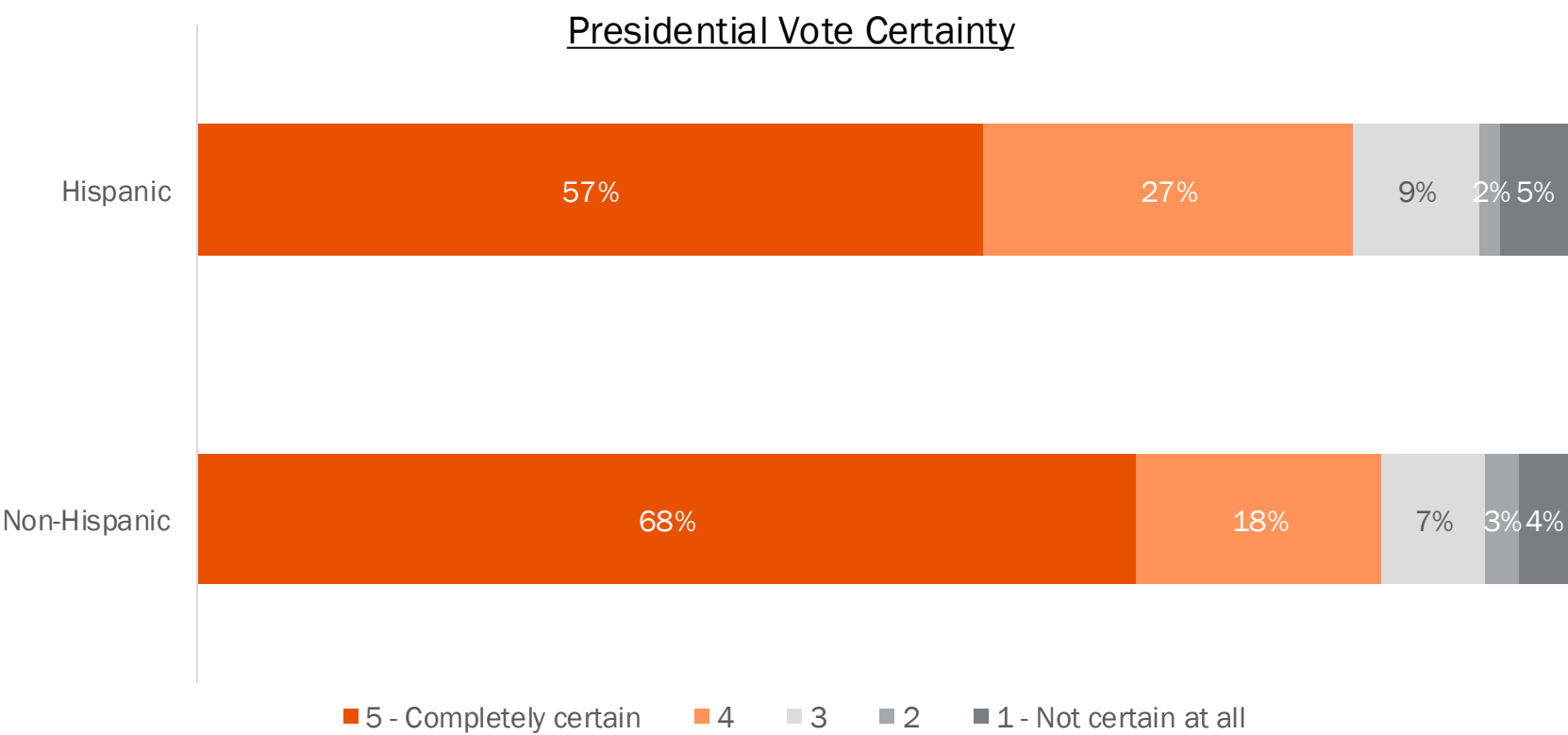

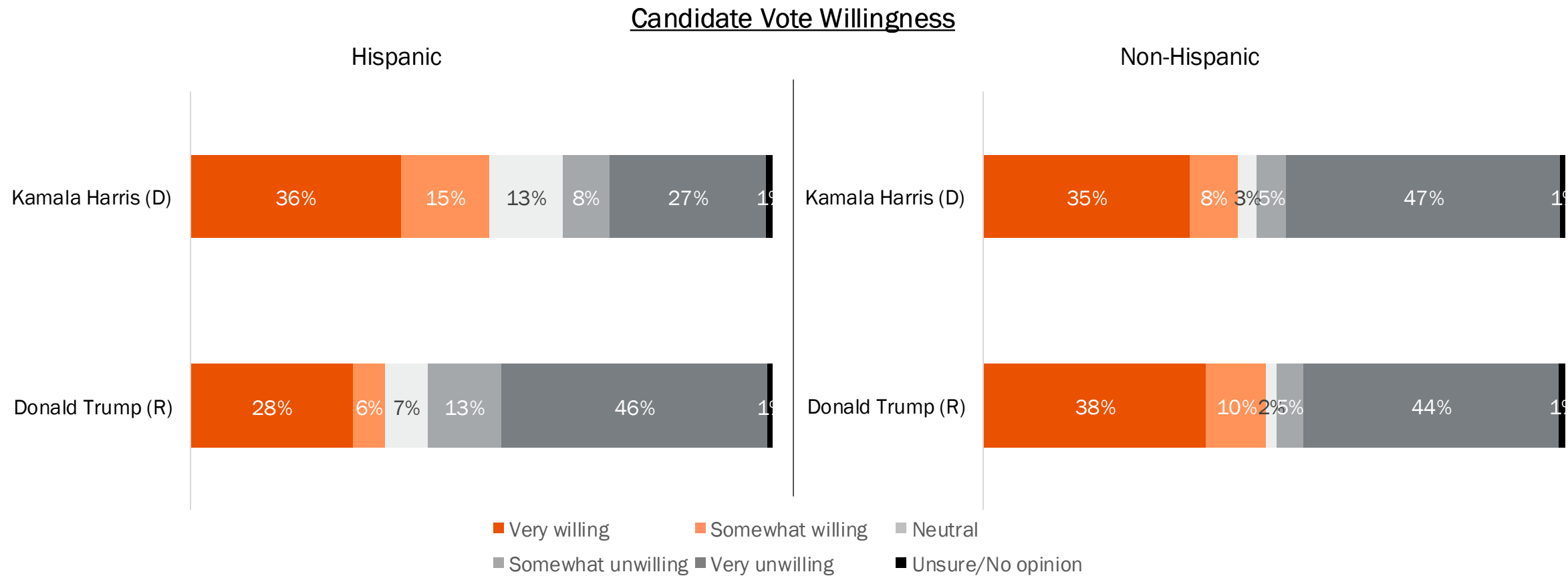

Willingness to Vote for Candidates in General Election

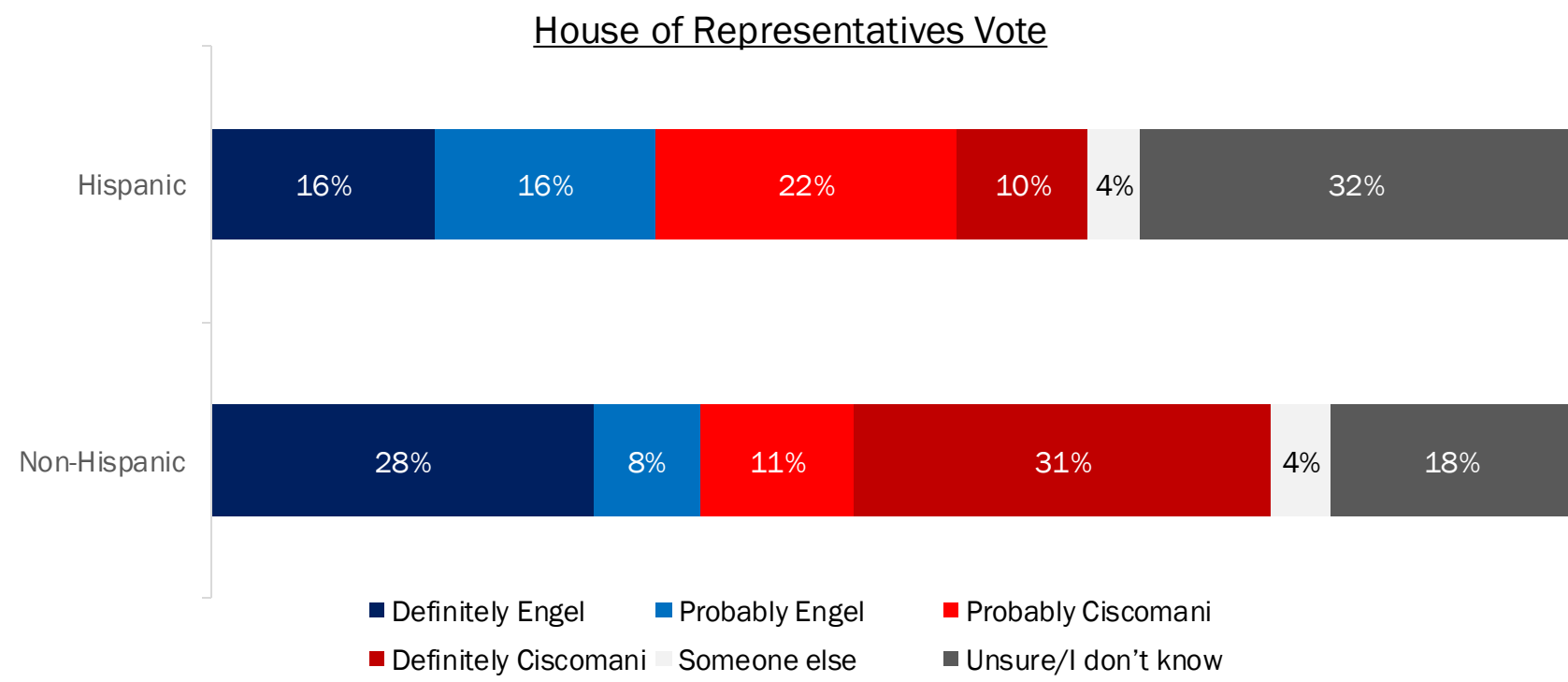

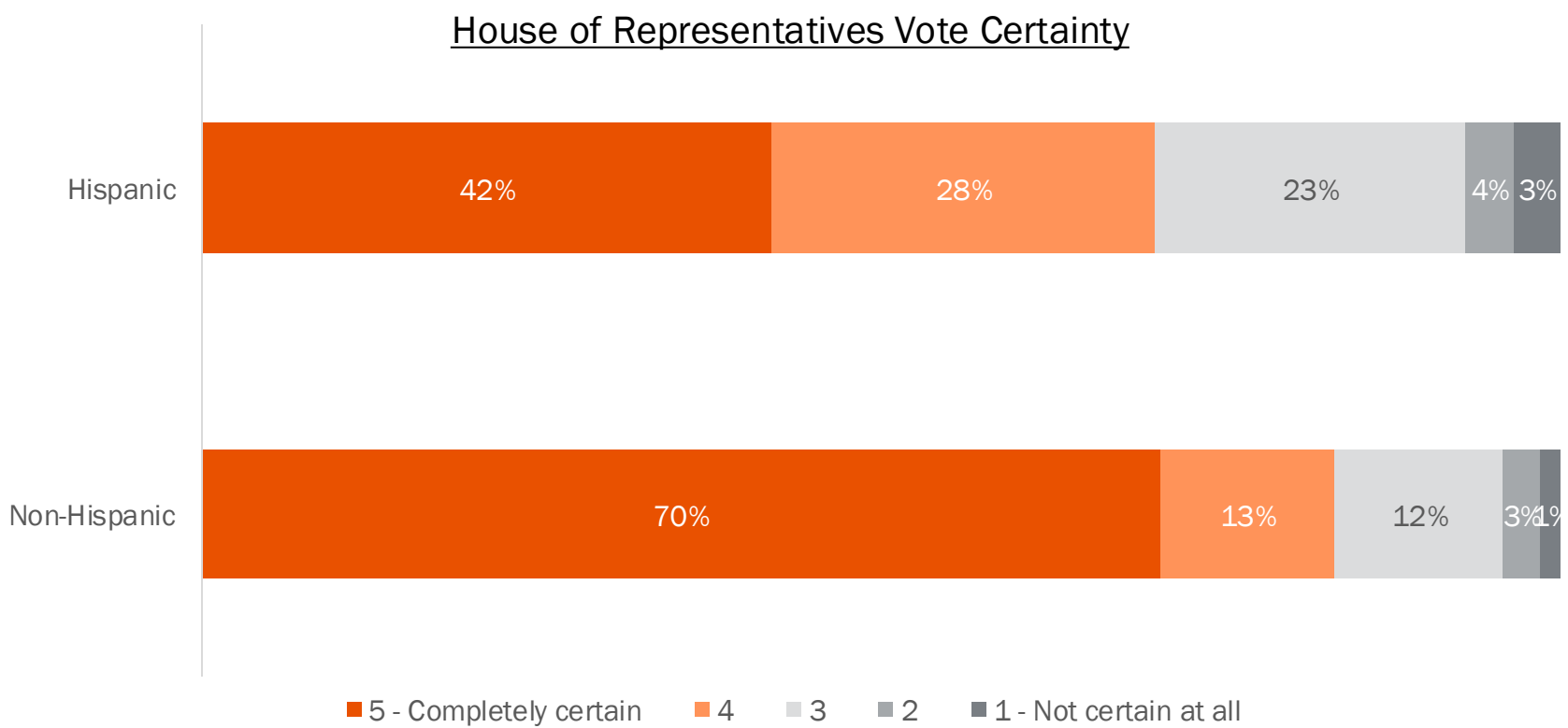

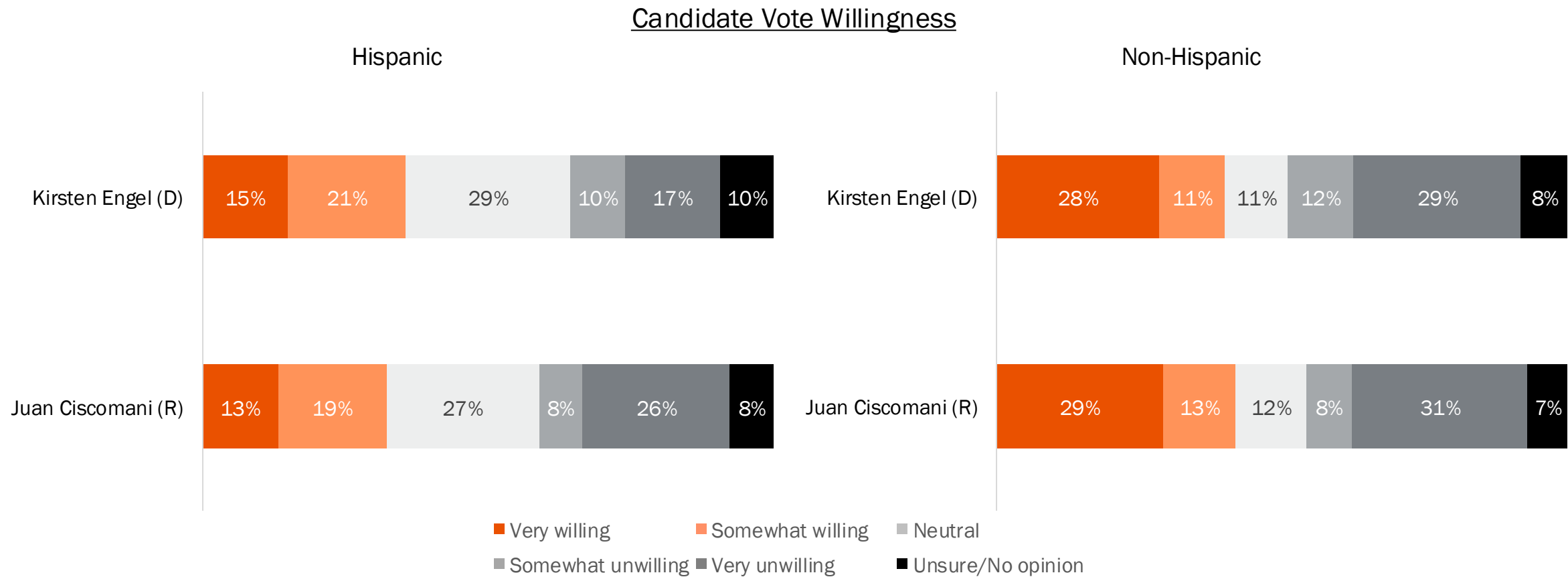

Willingness to Vote for Candidates in U.S. House of Representatives Election

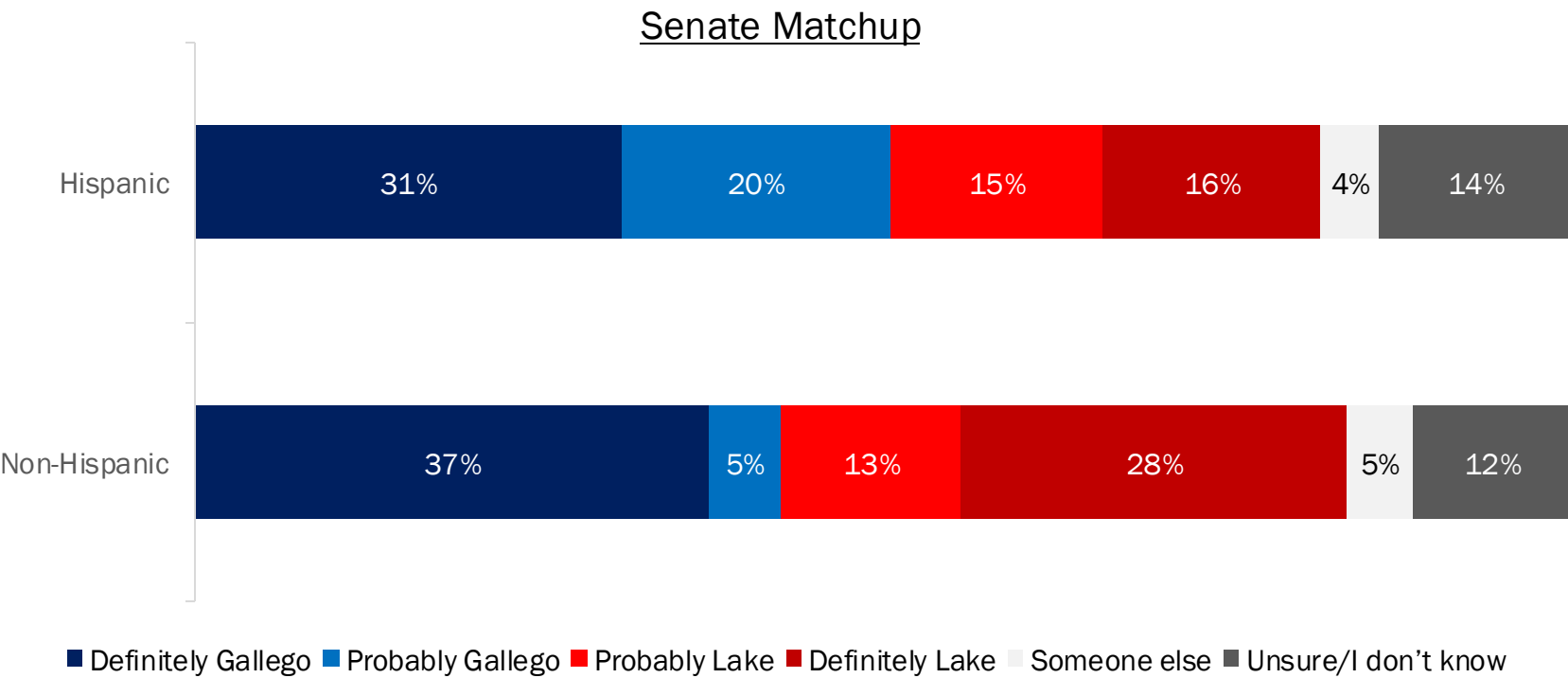

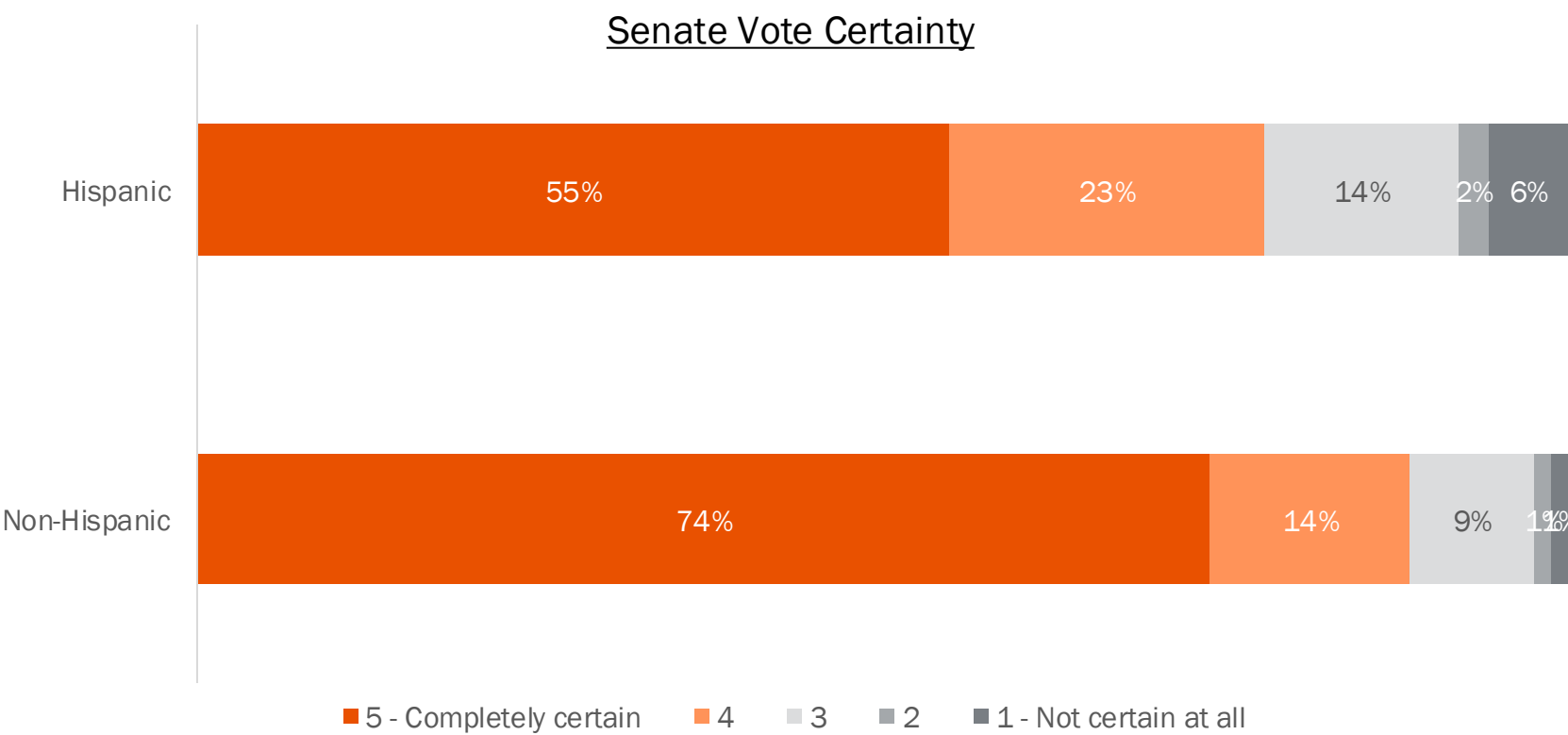

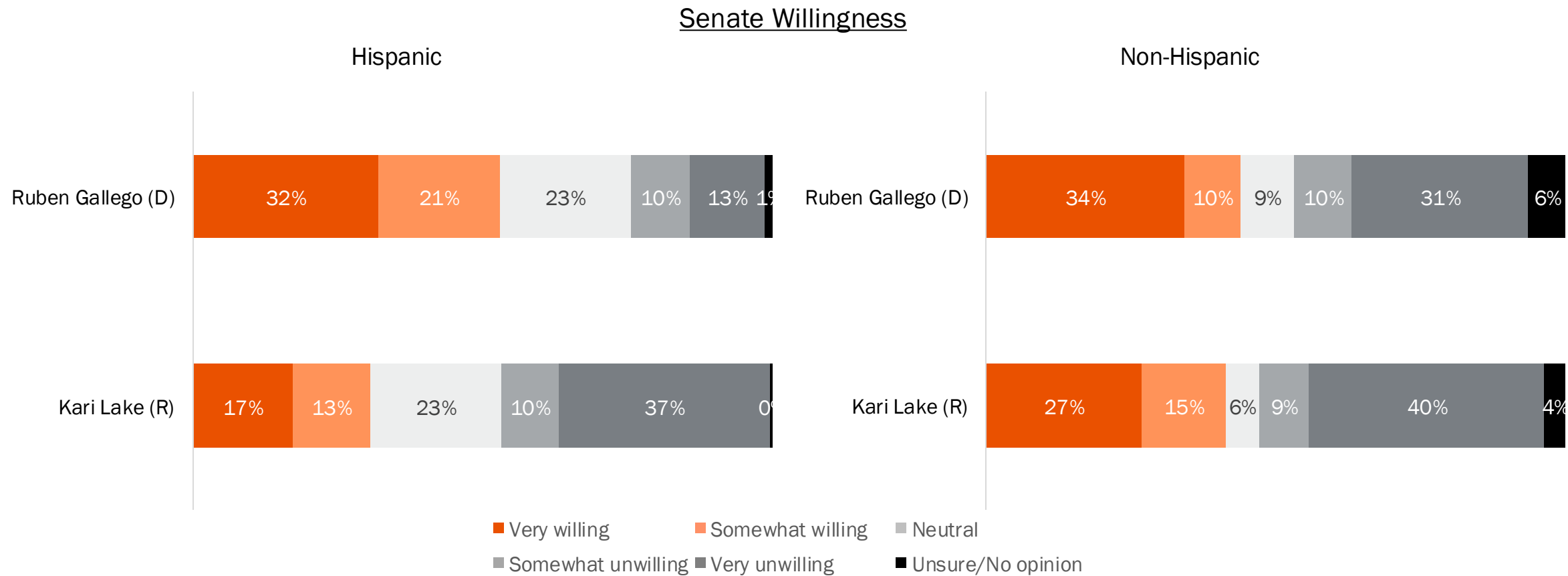

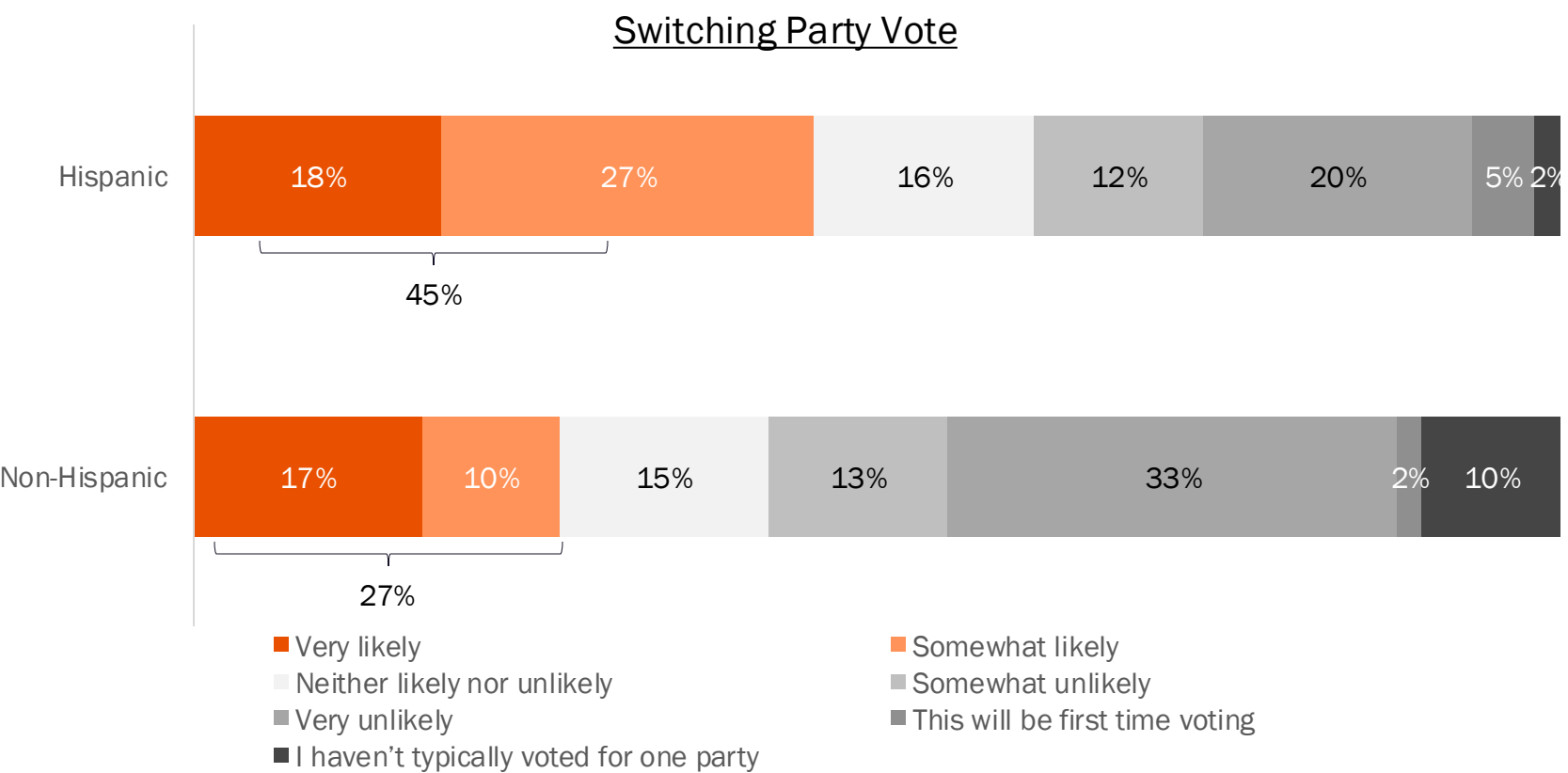
Willingness to Vote for Candidates in General Election

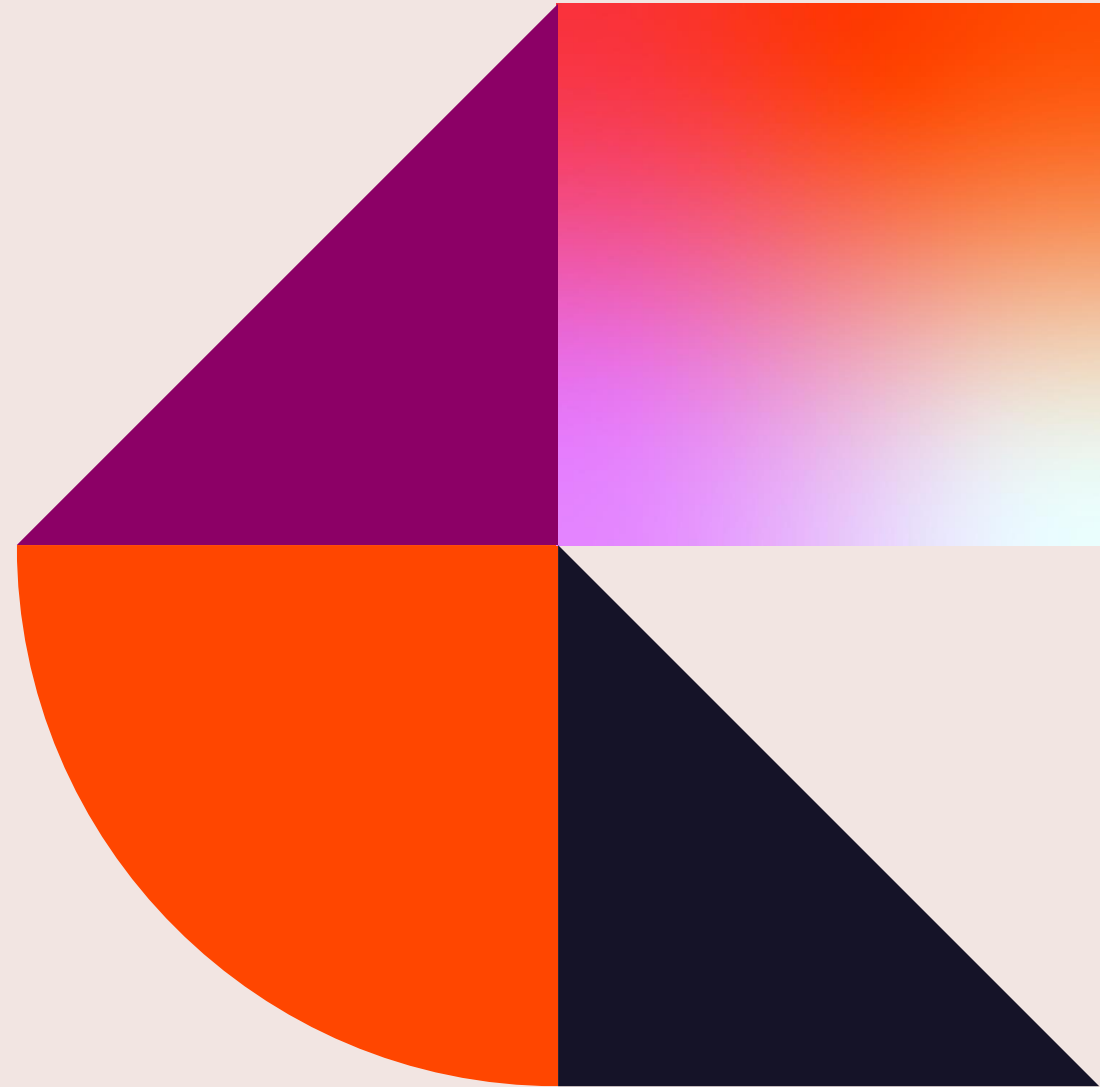


Hispanics More Likely than Non-Hispanics to Be Crossover Voters This Election

In the upcoming general election in November, how likely or unlikely are you to vote for a candidate from a political party t that you typically have not voted for in the past?

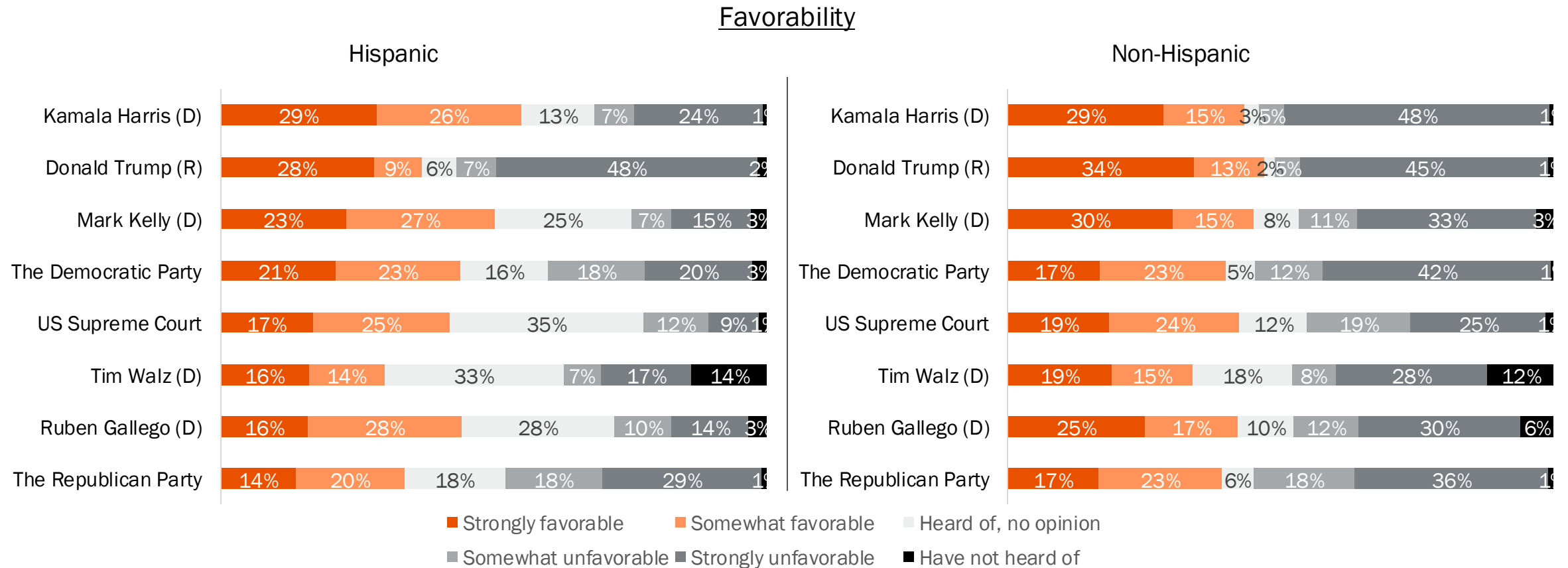

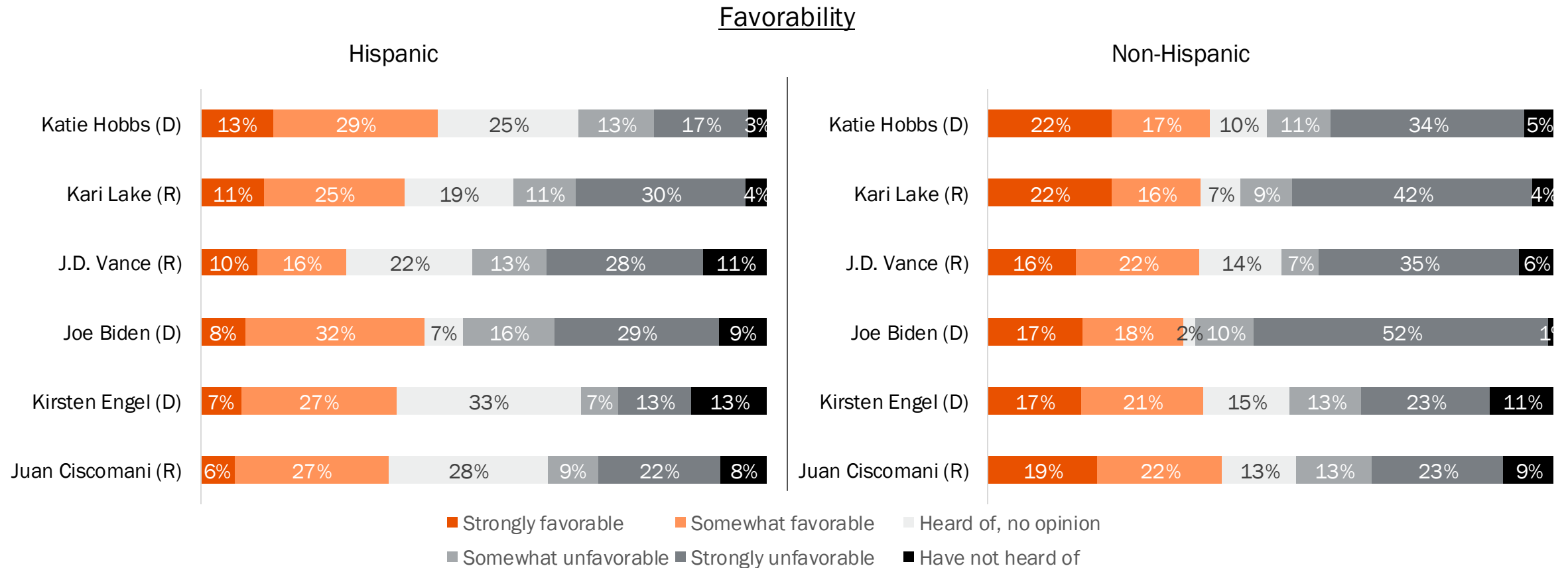

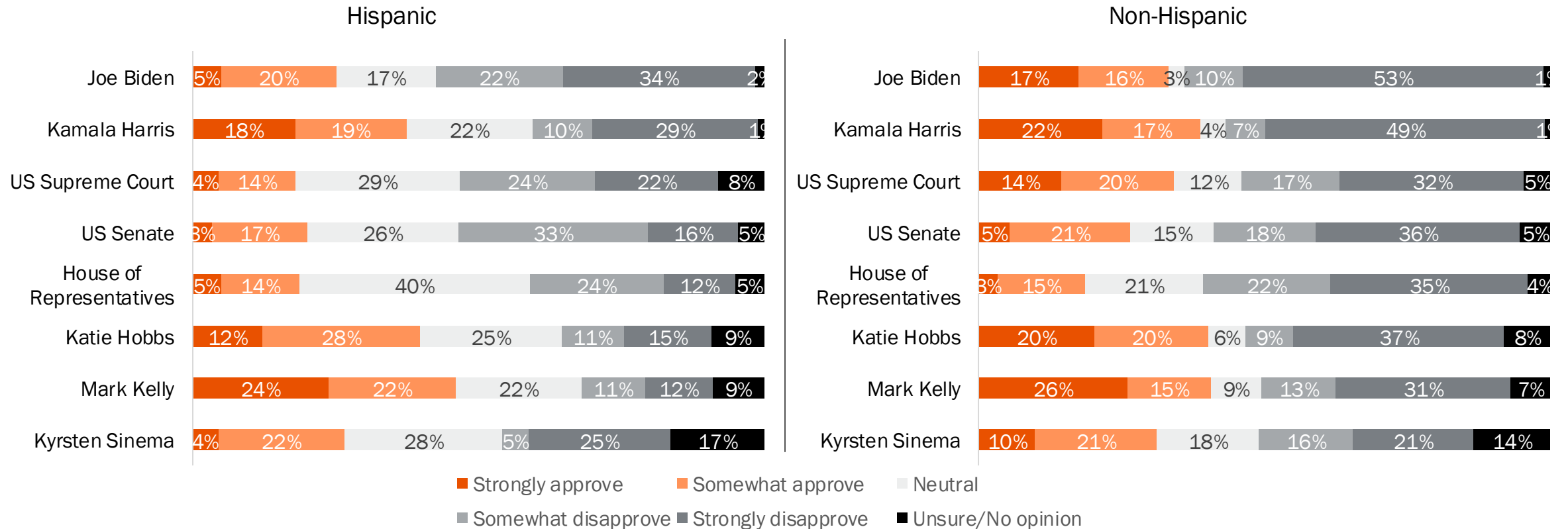

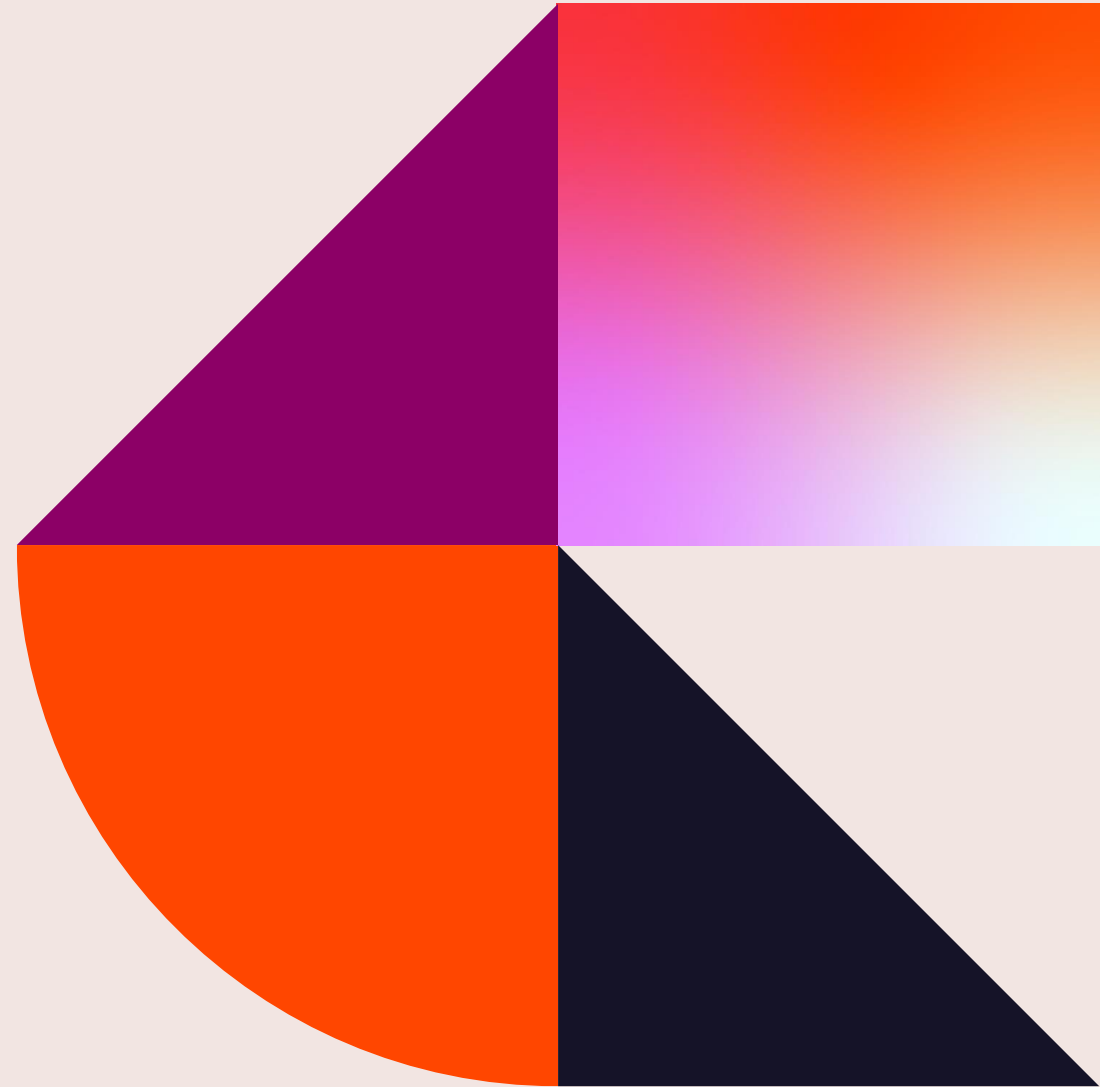

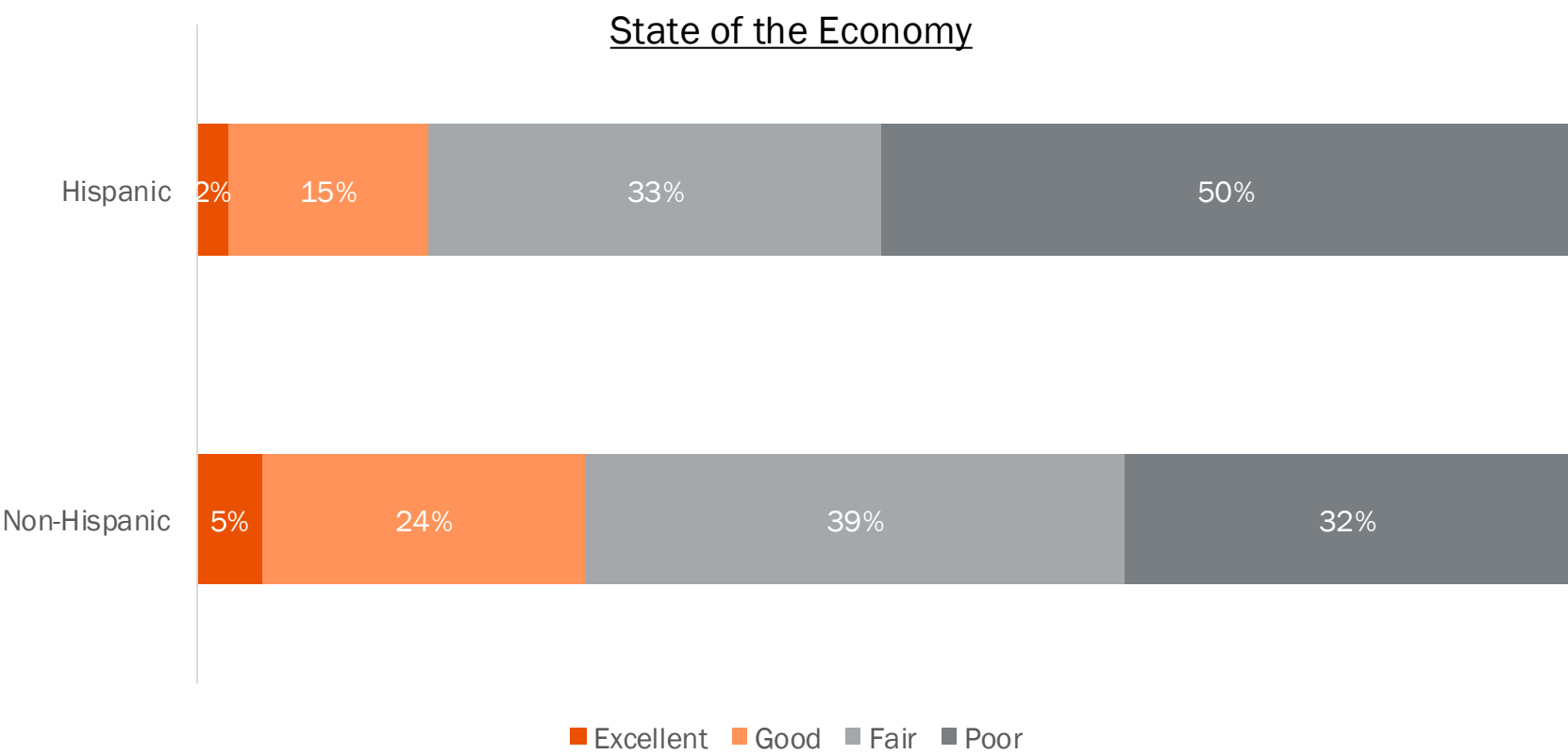

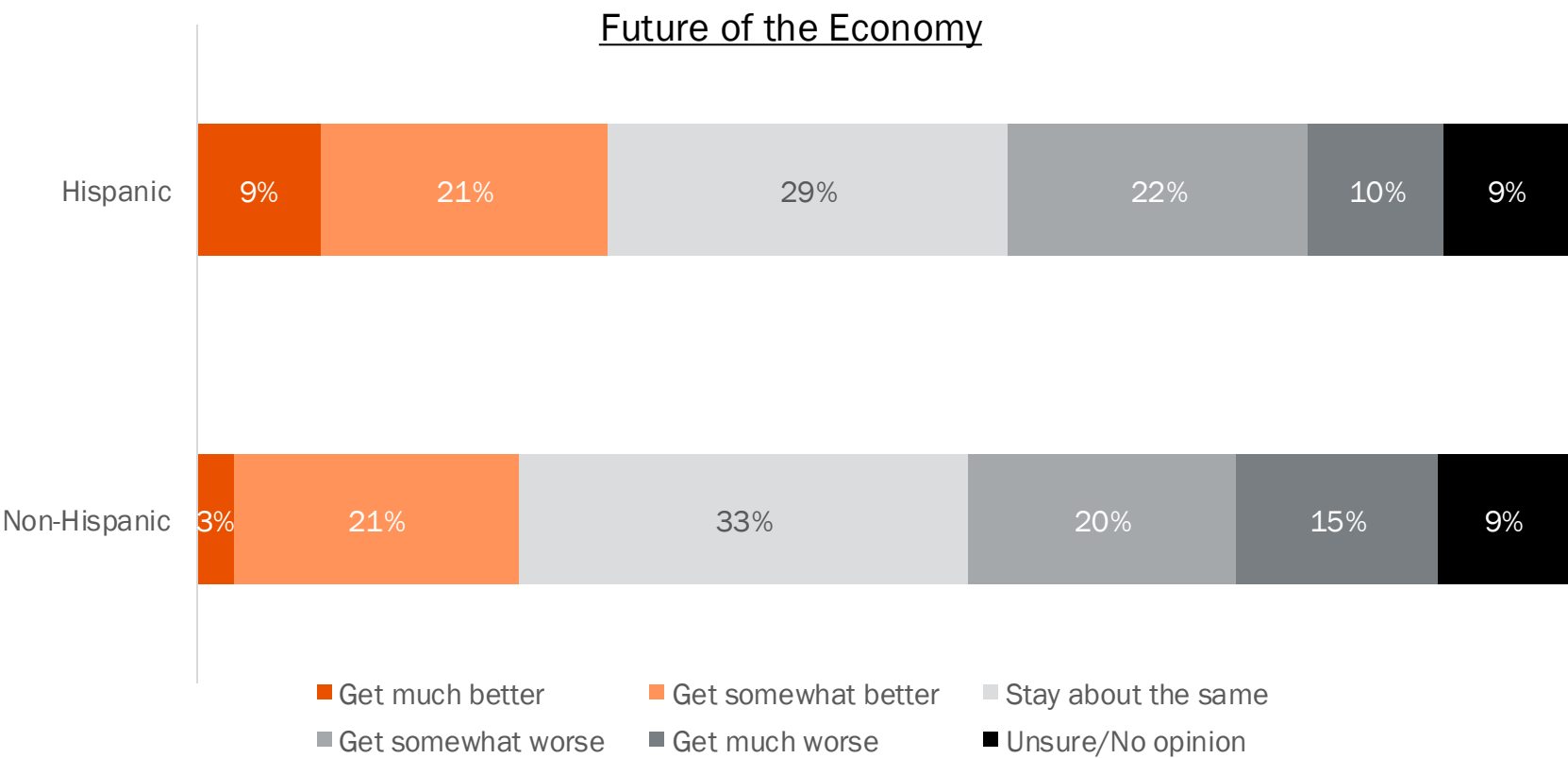

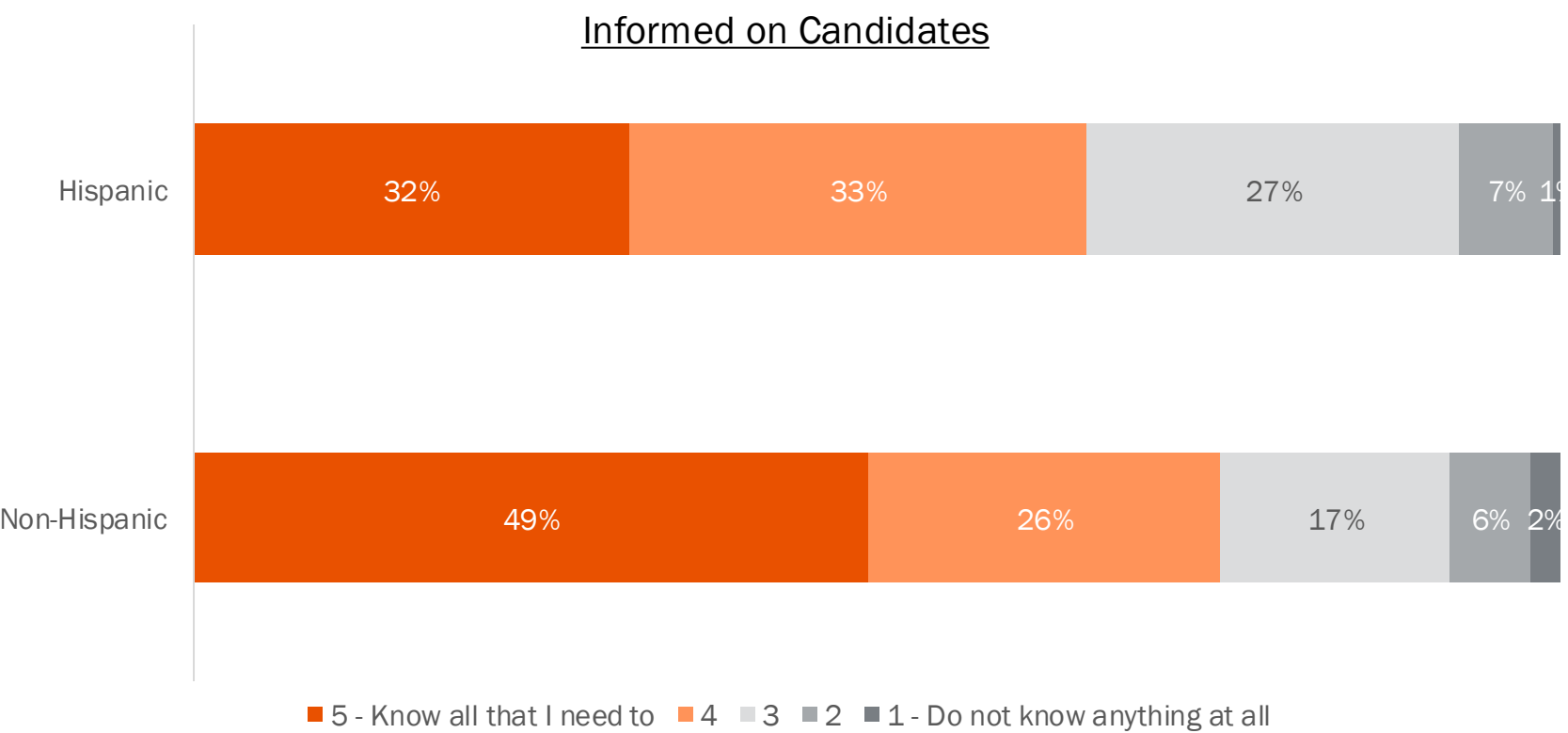

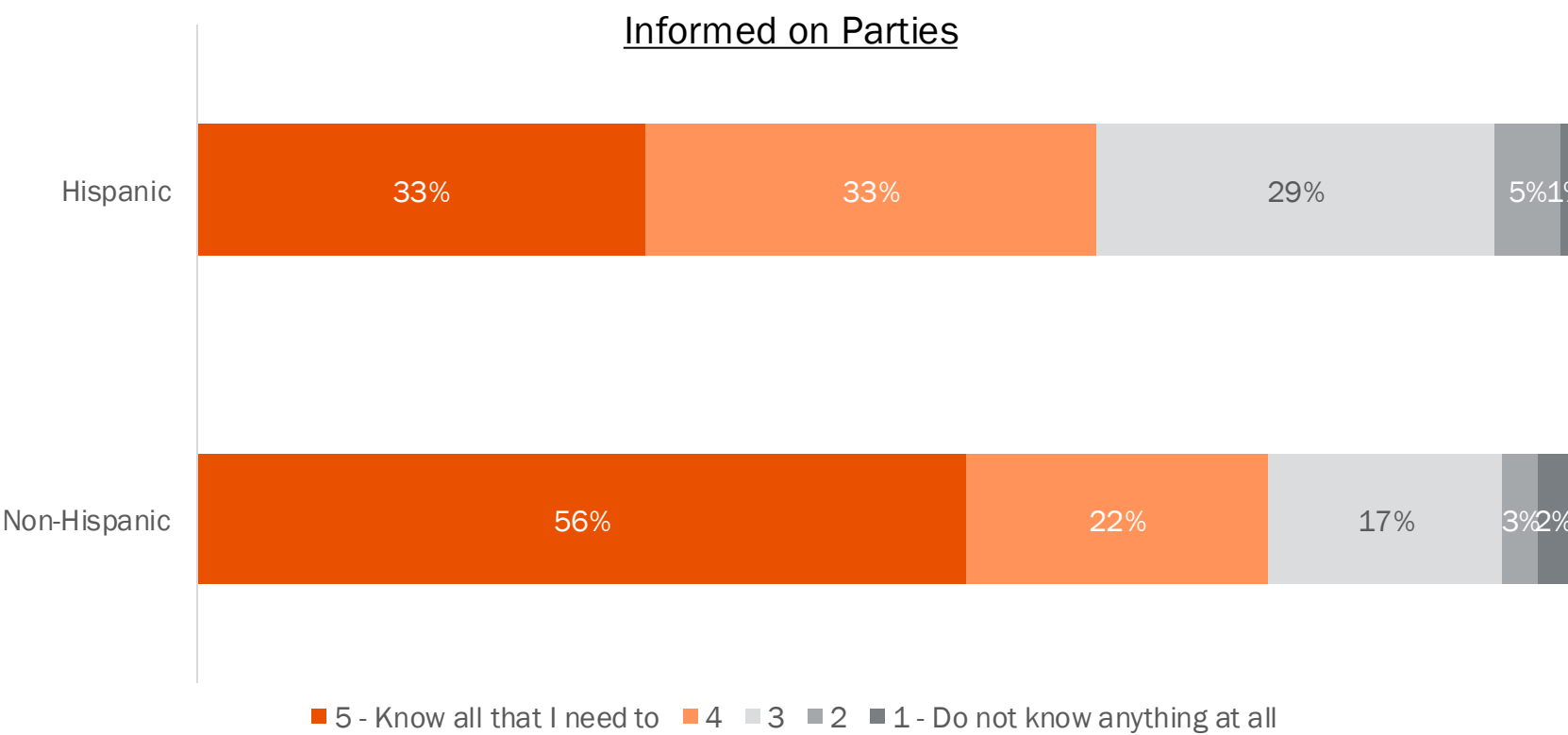

Do you think that you know enough now about the candidates and their positions on the issues most important to you to confidently make a voting decision?



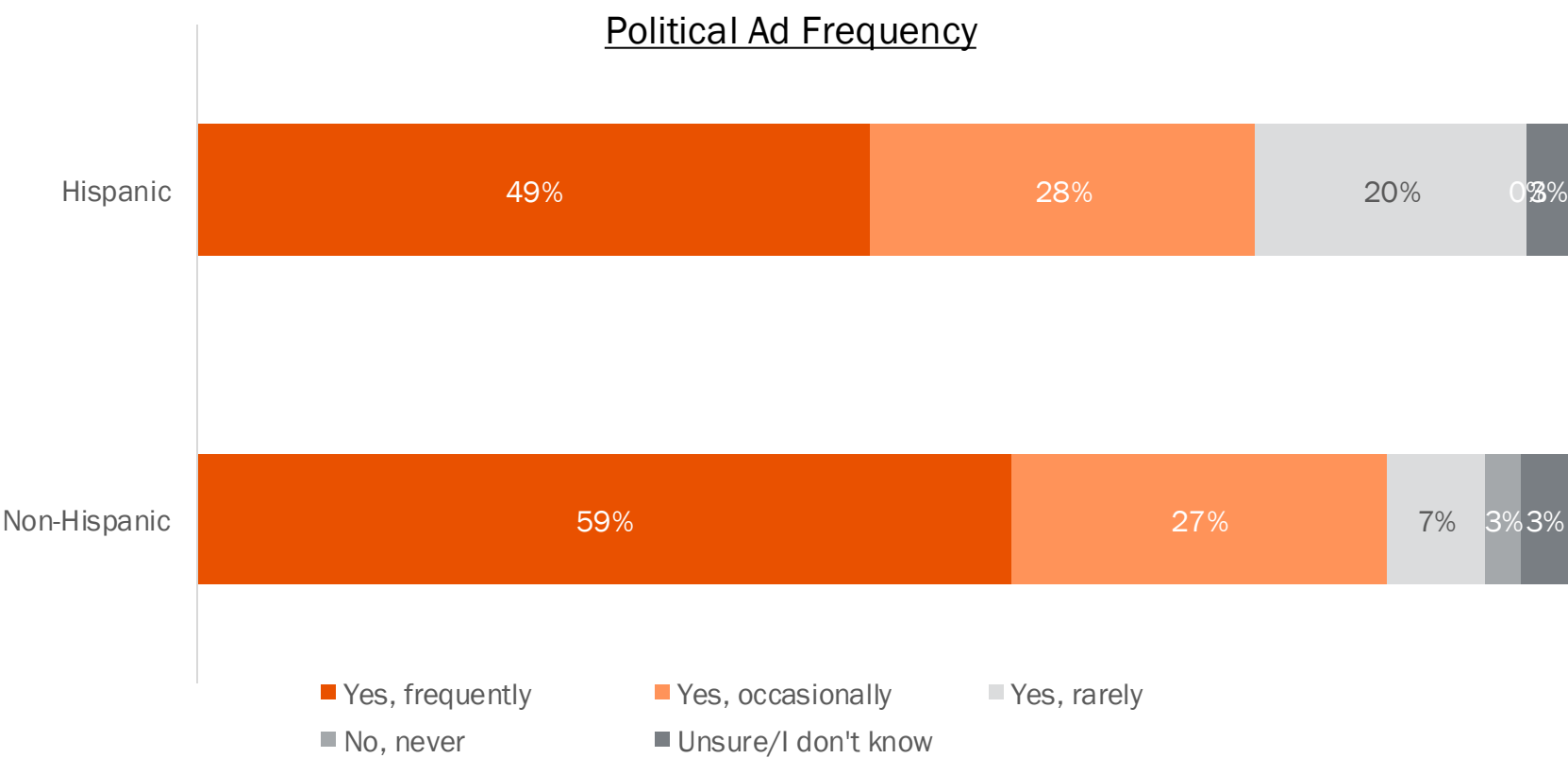
67% of Hispanics Don't Have All the Party Information They Need to Make Voting Decision

In the last 30 days, have you heard or seen any ads from political candidates or their campaigns in an effort to win your vote?





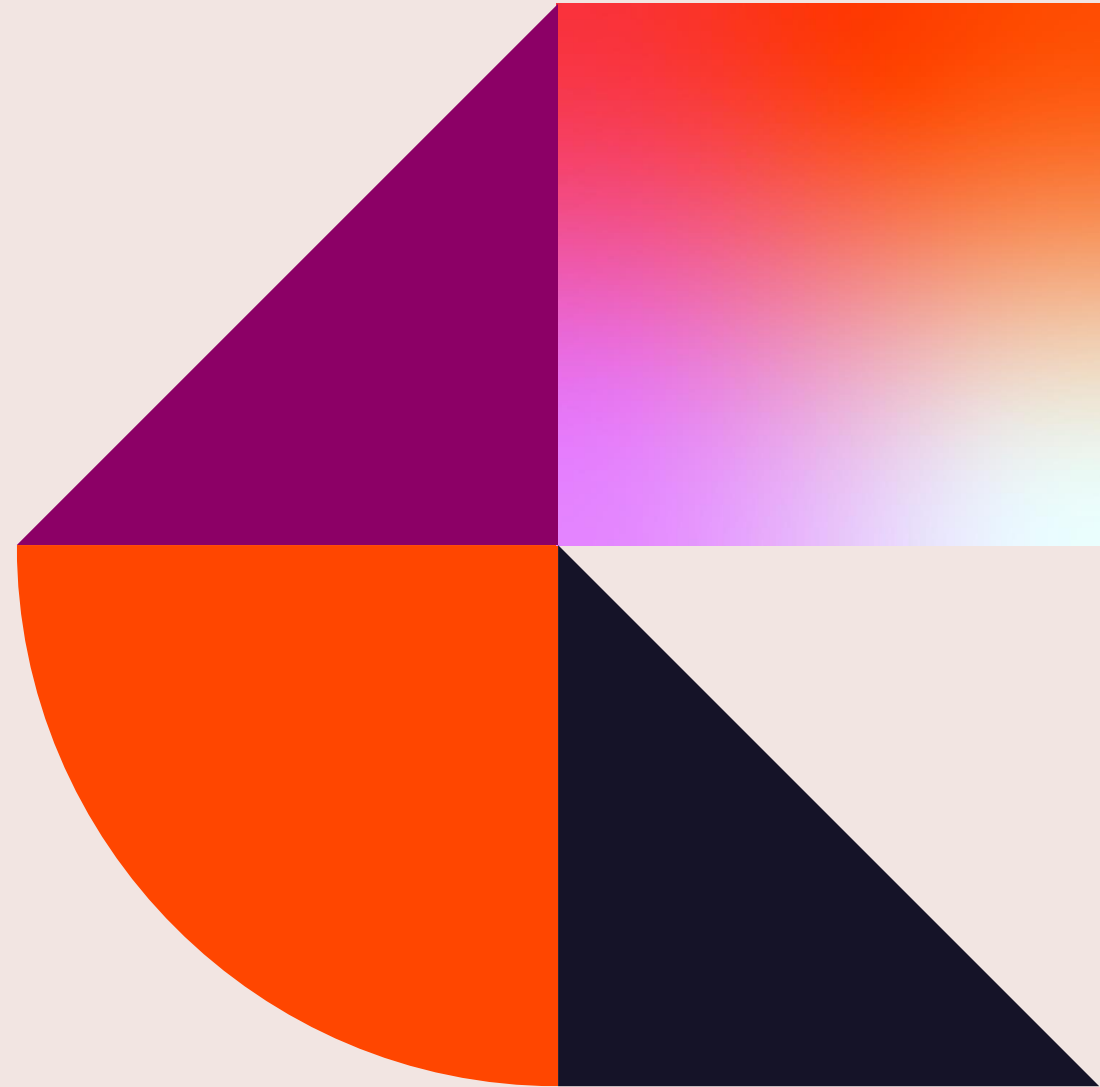

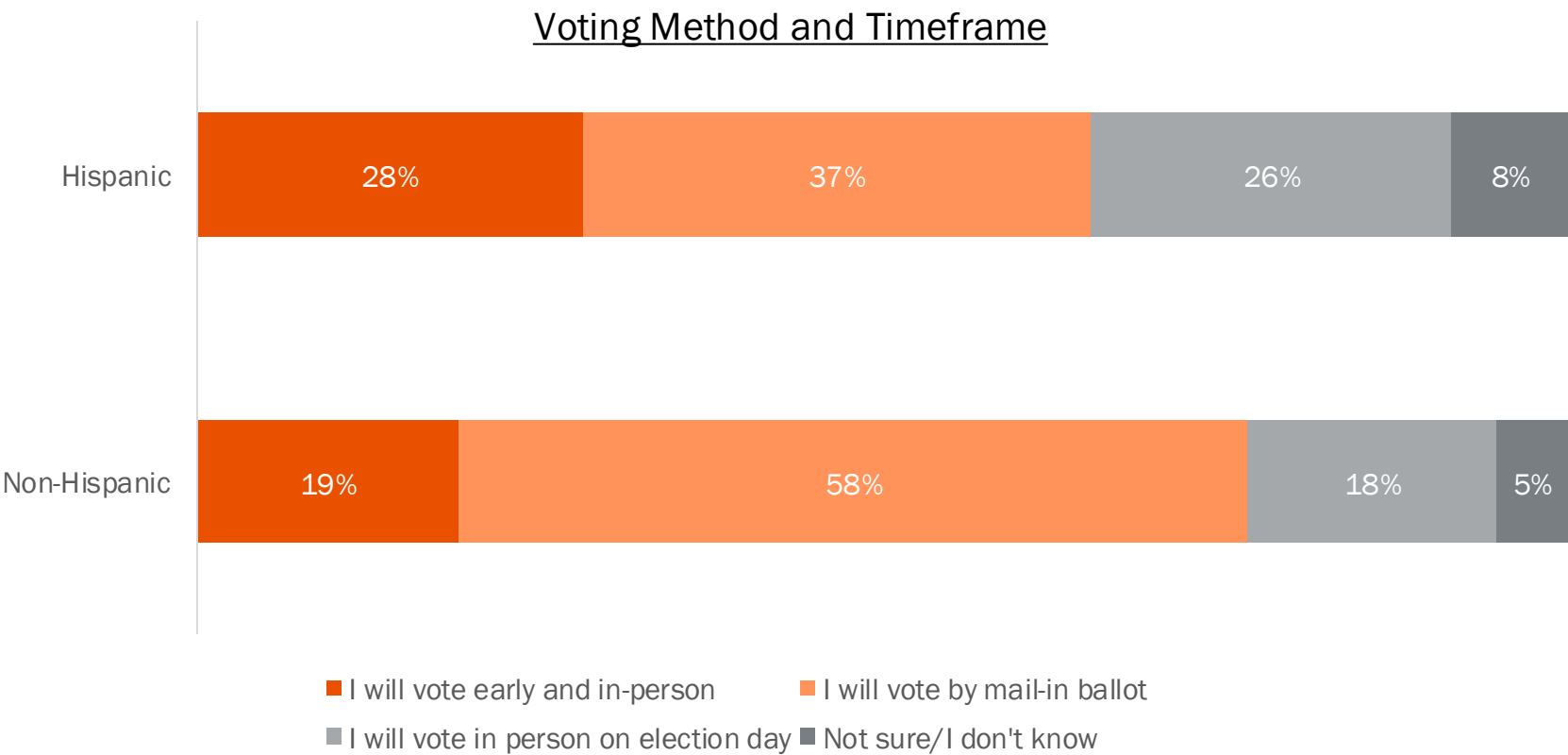

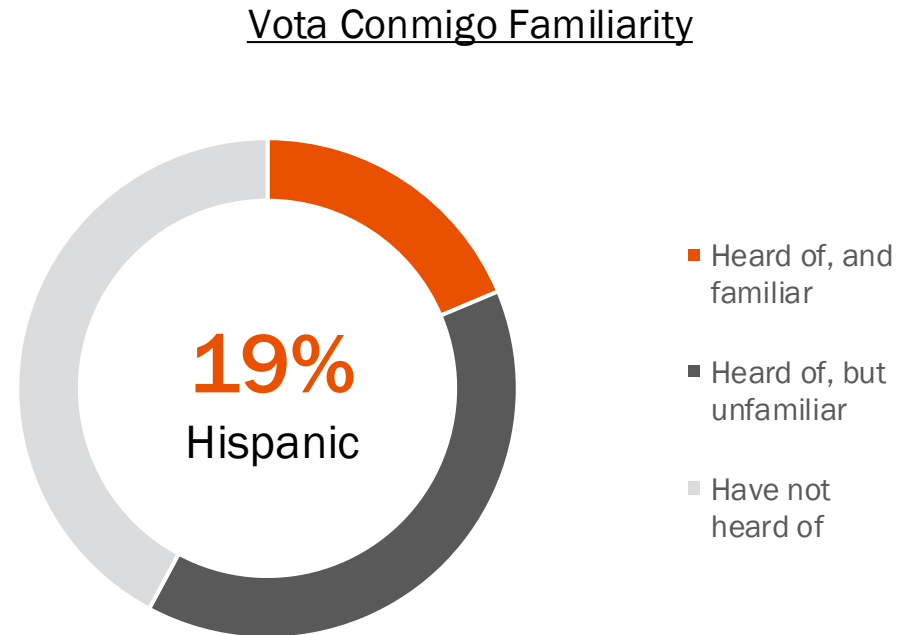

How do you plan to vote in the General election?



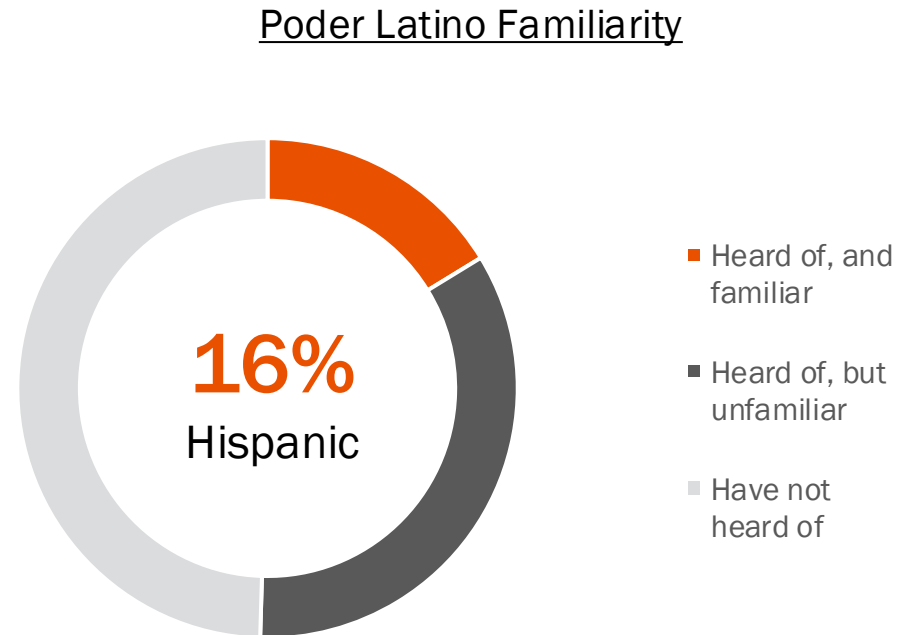
Vota Conmigo Familiarity

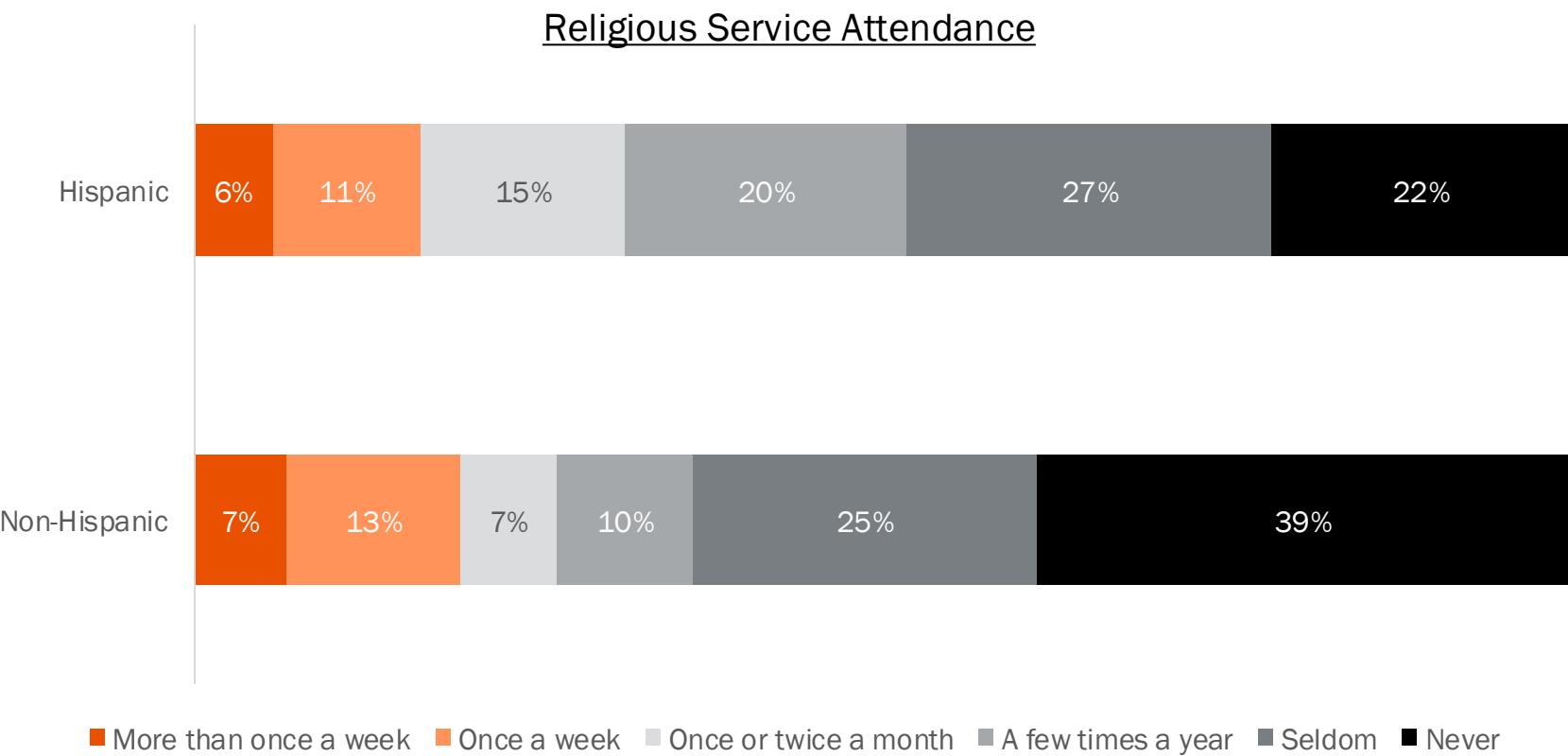
